The Corporate Secretary announced that pursuant to the Bylaws of this Authority, public notice of this meeting of the DRPA Board of Commissioners has been given by posting proper notice in the lobby at One Port Center, and issuing proper notice to the public and news media.

Vice Chair Nash called the meeting to order. He asked the Corporate Secretary to call the roll. The Corporate Secretary called the roll and announced that there was a quorum. Vice Chair Nash presided.

Vice Chair Nash thanked everyone for coming to the meeting. He indicated that one of the changes made by DRPA has been to hold Board meetings in rotating locations within the DRPA Port District rather than holding all meetings at DRPA Headquarters. Tonight we are in West Deptford at the RiverWinds. He stated that he appreciated that members of the public have taken time from their schedules to attend.

Report of the Chief Executive Officer

Vice Chair Nash then called on the CEO to supplement his written CEO report.

Mr. Matheussen thanked the Vice Chair and said his CEO Report stands as submitted with the addition of two items. Mr. Matheussen said Chief Dave McClintock would provide additional information on a monthly initiative our Department of Public Safety has instituted in an effort to enhance safety on our bridges. One specific safety violation is targeted each month. He introduced the Chief to provide more information.

Chief McClintock stated that last year Public Safety starting working with Engineering to reduce speed in construction zones on DRPA facilities. The program begins by targeting one unsafe practice each month through an education program using variable message boards to educate the public. In the following month Public Safety begins an enforcement effort targeted at the specific safety issue. Chief McClintock stated that his lieutenants came to him and proposed the idea of monthly initiatives to help educate the public. The program began in January focusing on distracted drivers, particularly people driving while texting or using their cell phones. As a part of this educational effort DRPA had approximately 700 vehicles stops - some were issued warnings and some were issued summons but prior to that action, the VMS boards gave warnings to not text or talk on cell phones. In February the initiative was unsafe vehicles which would include bad inspection stickers as well as vehicles with snow and ice piled on their roofs. For the month of March the initiative is seatbelts in conjunction with the "click it or ticket it" program and the use of child restraints. The program is working well and the objective is to educate the public about issues that contribute to accidents. The initiative has also moved to PATCO and in April the initiative will be unsafe taxi cabs at PATCO stations in New Jersey. Our passengers hire cabs in Lindenwold, Broadway, Ferry Avenue and Ashland and we will be making sure that the cab drivers are properly licensed drivers and make sure they are safe cabs. The Authority has had very positive results with these initiatives and as the program moves forward, Chief McClintock will make further presentations.

Commissioner DiAntonio commended the police with slowing down traffic; he mentioned that as a former Union president he can state that workers really appreciate this type of effort and it makes

the workers more productive. He stated that having police cars present on the premises slows down traffic and he commended DRPA Public Safety for a job well done.

CEO Matheussen stated that PATCO has a new program called the quiet car. He asked Mr. Rink to speak about the program. Mr. Rink stated that the program has been in effect for three weeks. He stated that PATCO has received positive feedback from customers through email and social media. Mr. Rink concluded that things are going well.

Vice Chair Nash stated that he has been taking PATCO recently and he commended PATCO on how nice and clean the trains and stations were and indicated that he has seen police presence on the premises and that the signage was great. Tell people at PATCO they are doing a great job.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Report of the CEO was approved.

Approval by the Audit Committee of the Audit Committee Minutes of March 16, 2012

The Minutes of the Audit Committee Meeting of March 16, 2012 were previously provided to the members of the Committee. Vice Chair Nash called on Commissioner Teplitz to provide a report.

Commissioner Teplitz stated that the proposed resolution is based on the most recent meeting of Audit Committee. The DRPA Compact requires the Authority to undergo a performance audit every five years and as part of the 2010 reform, we have increased the frequency to every two years in order to provide a more focused audit. This will be the first of the more frequent audits. The Committee has gone through the competitive process, issued an RFP, analyzed the responses and are recommending CGR Management Consultants. The major objectives for this first performance audit are looking at the Public Safety and administrative functions of the DRPA. The Committee is pleased with CGR and has had good discussions with the consultant and requests the Board to adopt the Resolution.

On motion duly made and seconded, the Minutes of the March 16, 2012 Audit Committee Meeting were approved by the Audit Committee.

Commissioner Teplitz asked to add to his report, and stated that this Resolution is a performance audit and is different from the financial audit which was discussed at an earlier Board meeting. He stated that after the Board had selected the financial auditor, but before the Authority executed the agreement for the financial audit, the consultant came to the Authority with additional information. We had received a political contributions report from the selected firm which showed that they had made no political contributions. Before we signed the contract, the selected firm provided a revised report showing that they had made a number of political contributions that should have been disclosed in their initial report. He stated that he wanted to let the committee know about this before we signed the contract for the financial audit. We have reviewed the new disclosures and we see no evidence of any effort to influence the award of the contract. He concluded that he expected the audit to go well.

Item 1 – Consideration of Pending DRPA Contracts (Between 25,000 and \$100,000)

Susan Squillace, Acting Manager, Purchasing stated that there were six contracts with DRPA and a summary of these contracts is attached to the Resolution.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted and made the action of the Authority:

DRPA-12-031 Consideration of Pending DRPA Contracts (Between 25,000 and \$100,000)

<u>Item 2 – Annual Church Requests for Parking Under the Ben Franklin Bridge in Philadelphia</u>

Tim Pulte, Chief Operating Officer, requested the Board to authorize staff to enter into an Agreement with three churches in Philadelphia to allow special event parking under the Ben Franklin Bridge in the DRPA lots located along Florist Street between 3rd and 4th Streets and/or between 2nd and 3rd Streets. The three churches which will use the DRPA parking lots are St. Augustine Roman Catholic Church, St. George Methodist Church and Old First Reformed United Church of Christ. No costs will be incurred by the DRPA Operations staff.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted and made the action of the Authority:

DRPA-12-032 Annual Church Requests for Parking Under the Ben Franklin Bridge in Philadelphia

<u>Item 3 – Five (5) 2012 Dodge Patrol Vehicles</u>

Tim Pulte, Chief Operating Officer, requested the Board to authorize staff to negotiate a purchase contract with Warnock Automotive, Inc., DBA Warnock Fleet, East Hanover, NJ for the purchase of five (5) 2012 Dodge Charger Police Vehicles in the amount of \$154,556.65. The five vehicles are being purchased under Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Contract Costar #013-024. The vehicles that are being replaced cannot be efficiently maintained due to their length of

service and mileage. The five vehicles that are to be replaced will be sold at auction and which will not take place until September or October when the new cars come in, so the current mileage on the old vehicles will continue to increase.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted and made the action of the Authority:

DRPA-12-033 Five (5) 2012 Dodge Patrol Vehicles

Item 4 – Bridge Property Program & Claims Made Excess Liability Policy - Extension

Toni Brown, Chief Administrative Officer, requests Board authorization to extend the existing Bridge Property & Loss of Toll Revenue Program which will expire on June 30, 2012 for six (6) months. The extension will take the program through December 30, 2012. The extension policies will contain the same terms and conditions as the current policies. Staff also seeks Board authorization to extend, for six months, the existing DRPA Claims Made Excess Liability Policy which will expire on June 30, 2012. The extension will take the policy through December 30, 2012. The extension policies will contain the same terms and conditions as the current policies.

The Claims Made Excess Liability Policy rests on top of an umbrella policy and also covers six other liability policies. Those liability policies will be the subject of the next Resolution to be presented to the Board. Those policies are due to expire on December 31, 2012. We are seeking to extend those policies by six months, which will bring the new expiration dates to December 31, 2012. In order to prevent a gap in coverage of one day between the Claims Made Excess Liability Policy and the other liability policies, the Authority has asked Graham to go back to Lexington and seek coverage for the one day. Lexington stated that they did not think this would be a problem but they might have to charge us an additional premium of \$2,500 for the one day of coverage. The Authority has asked the Graham Company to go back and push for that one day and try to have that additional premium charge eliminated.

Prior to the Board arriving tonight the Board packet was corrected as follows. On page 3 under AXIS Surplus, originally there was no commission listed. It has been corrected on the Summary Statement that the Graham Company will receive a 10% commission. At the end of the Summary Statement and Resolution, the total amount of the extension premium was listed as \$2,291,002. This was an incorrect amount and the correct amount is \$1,377,850.

Commissioner Simon inquired if the proposed premiums are consistent with the budgeted amounts in the current budget and Ms. Brown indicated that they are consistent with the budget. There may be a slight 8-10% increase on the extension premium for the Claims Made Excess Liability Policy, but staff anticipated a premium increase as part of the 2012 Operating Budget. Commissioner Simon further wanted confirmation that Ms. Brown has verified with Graham and Willis that the commissions payable for the extensions will not be shared or split with any other brokerage firms and Ms. Brown indicated that she has verified that the commissions will not be split. However, Graham reminded Ms. Brown that they do work with another firm in connection with the OCIP Safety program, but they do not split commissions with that firm. Ms. Brown

reported that she had received an email from Graham Company on this topic, and wanted to read part of it for the record: "We (Graham Company) are working together with Compliance Management, Inc. (CMI) on Safety Services associated with the OCIP. Compliance Management will assist in OCIP construction project site visits and OCIP project meetings and will be compensated for their work on these projects." Commissioner Simon noted that in the recent past we have been able to obtain lower commissions from our brokers and he asked whether the commissions here are consistent. Ms. Brown reported that these commissions are consistent.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted and made the action of the Authority:

DRPA-12-034 Bridge Property Program & Claims Made Excess Liability Policy - Extension

Item 5 – DRPA Traditional Property & Casualty Program - Extension

Toni Brown, Chief Administrative Officer, requests Board authorization to extend the existing Traditional Property & Casualty Program which will expire on August 1, 2012. The extension policies will contain the same terms and conditions as the current policies. The extension will take the policy through December 31, 2012. All extension policies associated with this program will be placed by our broker, Willis. Ms. Brown advised the Board that the total amount of the extension premiums is \$509,815. There was one correction on the Resolution: On page 3 under Duration of Contract the date of expiration was listed as December 30, 2012 and it was corrected to say that the policy will expire on December 31, 2012. Ms. Brown indicated that the brokers have verified that these commissions will also not be split or divided.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted and made the action of the Authority:

DRPA-12-035 DRPA Traditional Property & Casualty Program - Extension

<u>Item 6 – Southeast Youth Athletic Association (SEYAA) Carnival on DRPA (WWB)</u> <u>Property at 7th and Packer in Philadelphia</u>

Tim Pulte, Chief Operating Officer, requested Board authorization to enter into an agreement with SEYAA permitting use of DRPA property on the northwest corner of 7th & Packer Streets in South Philadelphia, for a fundraising carnival event from April 2, 2012 to April 15, 2012. There is no cost incurred by DRPA related to this event and all cleaning, security and insurance issues are the responsibility of SEYAA and its contractors. Mr. Pulte stated that as background for this Resolution, DRPA has had a license agreement with SEYAA since 1994 at no cost to DRPA. The agreement requires that SEYAA is responsible for all property maintenance and insurance costs on a year-round basis, not just for this event.

Mr. Pulte responded to Commissioner Sasso's inquiry about the costs of security and stated that SEYAA hire their own personnel. Mr. Lopez stated that SEYAA hire off-duty police officers to handle security for the event.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted and made the action of the Authority:

Southeast Youth Athletic Association (SEYAA) Carnival on DRPA (WWB) Property at 7th and Packer in Philadelphia

Public Comment

Vice Chair Nash stated that at this point any members of the public who wish to speak may do so. The Corporate Secretary called on Ms. Tami Caesar.

Ms. Caesar introduced herself as President of the National MS Society, Greater Delaware Valley Chapter. She stated that she was at the Board Meeting to speak on PATCO-12-009. She requested that the MS Bike Event be able to use the Woodcrest Station as it is the only facility in the area that they can stage from. She further stated that 50% of their annual revenue comes from the bike tour.

Vice Chair Nash stated that he is one of the bikers for the MS Event and it is very important cause. He stated that this is a 75 plus mile ride to Ocean City, New Jersey and it is an amazing spectacle to see 7,000 people participating in this event where the last mile of the rider is the hardest. He continued that he believes this is the most successful bike fund raiser in the country. Ms. Caesar stated that it actually is the second behind the State of Texas but how could we compete with the entire State of Texas. In closing she asked Board support for this important event and Vice Chair Nash indicated his personal support.

Vice Chair Nash stated that Mr. Fred Winkler, a Member of the Citizens Advisory Committee was present and he thanked him for his volunteering on the Committee. Mr. Winkler stated that he has a history of what was here at RiverWinds before. He also stated that the extension of the Glassboro Line would be most helpful. He volunteered that if he can assist, he would be willing to assist.

Mark McMichael [in his Elvis costume] commended the DRPA for keeping the toll areas clean and for giving him a job of sweeping up loose change at the toll buckets. He thanked the DRPA for "keeping the bridges free from the barnyard animals". He stated that when he pays his \$5 and the toll person thanks him he says "no sir or ma'am, thank you very much."

On motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned.

To the Commissioners:

The following is a summary of recent DRPA activities. I have attached the appropriate reports.

Bridge and Finance

The Ben Franklin Bridge structural improvement project is 90 percent complete, and the installation of under-bridge lighting continues on schedule.

The DRPA has sent requests for qualifications to consultants who might be interested in designing the proposed pedestrian and bicycle ramp to replace the existing stairway on the south side of the Ben Franklin Bridge in Camden. Statements of qualifications were due March 7th.

Engineering is also soliciting consultants for the investigation and design for the cleaning, repointing and repair of granite masonry on the Ben Franklin Bridge.

Engineering is working with the City of Philadelphia and their consultant on the proposed extension of Delaware Avenue under the Betsy Ross Bridge. The DRPA sent property plans to the consultant as requested, and internal discussions about the easement continue.

In a related matter, the City of Philadelphia has agreed to take possession of the DRPAowned portion of Hedley Street during the second phase of the Delaware Avenue extension project.

Stage Two of the Walt Whitman Redecking project is expected to be completed next month.

The DRPA is working with the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Camden County, Camden City, NJ Transit and other entities on a Camden Gateway Project to improve the appearance of various Camden entry roadways and structures.

designated a "quiet car," or a place where conversations, music from earphones and other ambient noise will be banned.

In late February, PATCO also announced plans to install elevators at the 9th/10th & Locust Station in Philadelphia and the Ferry Avenue Station in Camden. The \$5 million project – which includes \$1.5 million in federal money and should be completed by year's end – will make both stations more accessible.

New compressors, pumps and grating have been installed at the City Hall, 8th & Market, Franklin Square and Woodcrest stations. All of the software interfacing, configurations and training have been completed.

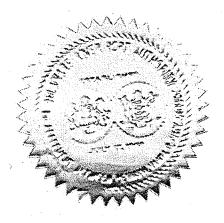

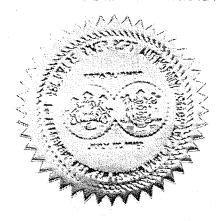

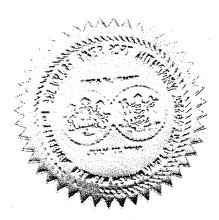

It will also put us in a good position for future expansion.

PROPOSAL:

Staff seeks Board authorization to extend for six (6) months the existing Bridge Property & Loss of Toll Revenue Program ("Bridge Property Program", which will expire on June 30, 2012. If approved, the existing Bridge Property Program would be extended until December 30, 2012. If approved, the extension policies will contain the same terms and conditions as the current policies.

Staff also seeks Board authorization to extend for six (6) months month the DRPA's Claims Made Excess Liability Policy, which will expire on June 30, 2012. If approved, the policy would be extended until December 30, 2012. If approved, the extension policies will contain the same terms and conditions as the current policies.

All extension policies associated with the Bridge Property Program, as well as the Claims Made Excess Liability extension will be placed by our broker, The Graham Company.

PURPOSE:

To extend for six months the required insurances necessary to reduce the DRPA's exposure to risk, physical damage, and economic loss, and exposure to liability.

BACKGROUND:

The Bridge Property Program consists of two distinct components. The Bridge Property portion of the program consists of a primary layer of bridge property damage insurance with a Loss Limit of \$300 million, and two excess layers of bridge property damage insurance providing a \$100 million Loss Limit each, for a total of a \$200 million excess of the primary layer of \$300 million. Together, the primary and excess property layers total \$500 million in Bridge Property Damage coverage. For each occurrence, the limits for the primary and two excess layers are reinstated.

The perils insured under the Bridge Property Program include direct physical loss of, or damage to property insured. The policy provides coverage for damage caused by flood, earthquake, and both certified and non-certified acts of terrorism, and any resulting loss of toll revenue to the bridges.

Bridge Property Program

The Loss Limit of the expiring primary layer of the Bridge Property Program is \$300 million, subject to a \$25 million deductible per occurrence. A \$75 million aggregate deductible "cap" is in place, and would remain in place throughout the extension period.

The primary layer of the Bridge Property Program is written on a quota share basis. Three carriers participate in the primary layer of the Quota Share Program. They are:

Arch Insurance Company – 21.7% Current Annual Premium = \$336,809 Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$168,872 (10% commission)

Travelers Property Casualty Company of America – 33.3% Current Annual Premium = \$518,626 Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$262,170 (10% commission)

Zurich American Insurance Company – 45% Current Annual Premium = \$699,553 Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$350,735 (10% commission)

After the \$300 million primary layer of the Bridge Property Program is exhausted, the first excess layer of Bridge Property insurance would respond up to \$100 million. There is one carrier at that level:

Ace American Insurance Company – 100% Current Annual Premium = \$149,683 Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$74,991 (10% commission)

The second excess layer of the Bridge Property Program is written on a quota share basis for an additional \$100 million in coverage, bringing the total value of the program to \$500 million. Two carriers participate on a quota share basis on the second excess layer. They are:

Landmark Insurance Company – 50% Current Annual Premium = \$56,275 Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$28,182 (10% commission)

AXIS Surplus Insurance Company – 50% Current Annual Premium = \$56,275 Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$28,182 (10% commission)

Claims Made Excess Liability Policy

The DRPA's Claims Made Excess Liability Policy provides coverage for claims involving bodily injury, personal injury, property damage and advertising injury, which are first made in writing against the DRPA during the policy term. The coverage only applies to claims that first commenced at a specific time after the June 1, 1986 retroactive date, and prior to the expiration date of the policy (and reported up to 120 days thereafter).

The current carrier is the Lexington Insurance Company. The policy limit for the expiring policy is \$25 million each accident/aggregate, subject to a \$5 million self-insured retention. The policy includes an annual aggregate reinstatement option (excess of \$5 million each accident self-insured retention) for 125% of the annual premium provided written notice is made within 125 days of the expiring policy. The current annual premium is \$843,291.

The 6-month extension estimated premium for the term 6/30/2012 to 12/30/2012, including terrorism is:

Lexington Insurance Company

Current Annual Premium = \$843,291 (9.5% commission)
Proposed 6-Month Extension Premium = \$464,738 (9.5% commission)
Note: The Chief Underwriting Officer for Lexington would not release
an extension option without a 10% increase.

Terrorism Coverage

The expiring Bridge Property Program and Claims made Excess Liability policies includes terrorism coverage as provided through the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act of 2007 (TRIA 2007). Under TRIA 2007, an "act of terrorism" is covered if certified as an "act of terrorism" by the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States. The definition of an "act of terrorism" has been

expanded in the 2007 TRIA extension to include not only acts committed by individuals acting on behalf of "foreign" persons or interests, but also "domestic" terrorism.

In the past, the Board has elected this terrorism coverage option.
